Year 2015 was declared “The Year of War Veterans” by a Government Decision in order to pay homage to the heroism of the Romanian soldiers who lost their lives during World War II which ended 70 years ago and as a sign of gratitude for the war veterans’ courage shown in the battles of the biggest conflagration.

The Ministry of National Defence organized gala concerts and performances dedicated to the war veterans and veterans of the theatres of operations which were honoured by prestigious artists of the Romanian music scene, under the motto “Sacrifice calls for respect”.

*Several special actions were conducted with the support of the soldiers passionate about sports from **Invictus România** Group. These actions succeeded in raising awareness of the civilian society over the respect that must be shown to the veterans, injured or disabled personnel and to the successors of the soldiers who died during military operations.*

*The leadership of the Department for the Parliament Relations and Public Information of the MoND, the **Charity Association of the Romanian Armed Forces – Camarazii** and active-duty soldiers of units across the country stood beside the veterans in their anniversary moments.*

*Also, in this special year dedicated to war veterans, Camarazii Association officially registered the **Romanian peony** (a species protected by law) as a symbol representative for all the events honoring to the heroism of Romanian soldiers. By wearing the Romanian peony on their lapel, the participants in these activities show respect for the acts of great courage of the Romanian soldiers of all time.*

The events conducted under the motto “2015-Year of War Veterans” were an opportunity to increase social cohesion over a project of national importance by bringing to attention the respect for the fundamental values of the state and of the Romanian Armed Forces, military profession and the country’s veterans.

Arch over time – the meeting of war veterans with the students

A significant and emotional event took place at the MoND Headquarters, on May 7th.

Ten war veterans, true living legends, and ten students with outstanding learning results of "Dimitrie Cantemir" National Military College met in what could be described as a veritable arch over time. A connection was made between the generation of the war veterans, and the generation represented by the best students who scored high at national and international competitions and in the previous academic year.

During the ceremony, the distinguished war veterans, Gheorghe Dumitrescu, Ion Căiniceanu, Constantin Miu, Nicolae Dobrovie, Stefan Iancu and Ioan Ștefănescu were promoted in rank to general while ten students got awards for outstanding learning results.

April 29th – War Veterans' Day

Each year, War Veterans' Day is celebrated on April 29th. The Decision was established in 2007, by Government Resolution no. 1222.

2015 was declared the year of war veterans. Therefore, the Ministry of National Defence organized several activities dedicated to those who fought for the country, for the independence and unity of the Romanian state.

A military and religious wreath laying ceremony was organized in Bucharest, to celebrate the memory of World War II heroes at the Homeland Heroes' Monument – on "Carol I" National Defence University's esplanade. The event was organized by the Ministry of National Defence together with the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the National Association of War Veterans that celebrated 25 years of activity this year.

May 9th – Romania's Independence Day, Europe Day and Victory Day

In the municipalities and localities that host military units, wreath laying ceremonies were organized to celebrate Romania's Independence Day, Europe Day and Victory Day, on May 9th.

In Bucharest, the ceremony dedicated to this day of triple significance took place at the Homeland Heroes' Monument from World War II, "Carol I" National Defence University.

May 21st - Heroes' Day

"The nation is immortal through the Cult of its Heroes", Nicolae Iorga used to say. Decree-Law no. 1693 issued on May 4th, 1920, stipulated that Heroes' Day be ordained as national holiday and be celebrated "with religious, educational, military and national pomp". The Decision was adopted by the Parliament of Romania in 1995.

The Ministry of National Defence organized military and religious ceremonies to celebrate Heroes' Day on May 21st.

Wreath-laying ceremonies took place at "Filantropia" Israeli Cemetery, at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Carol Park, at the Monument of the Heroes who fell on duty in Theatres of Operations and on the national territory (at the Children's National Palace), at the Homeland Heroes' Monument, from "Carol I" National Defence University and Ghencea National Cemetery.

May 22nd, 2015 – Memorial Day

On Memorial Day, Dean Thompson, Deputy Chief of Mission at the US Embassy in Romania and State Secretary Otilia Sava laid wreaths at the US Heroes' Monument from Cișmigiu Park, Bucharest.

The monument is built in memory of the 378 American soldiers who lost their lives in World War II. It was inaugurated in 2002; in 2006, it was rebuilt and replaced in a position which offers a better view on it.

2015 celebrated 70 years since the end of World War II, the biggest and the bloodiest armed conflict in the history of the mankind.

During the biggest world conflagration, Romania counted over 900,000 dead, injured, missing, prisoners or disabled people.

Almost 92,000 soldiers lost their lives while fighting on the battlefields.

Honouring the sacrifice of the homeland heroes on each occasion is a sign of respect for those who fought in World War II, "a country without heroes being like a house without doors" (Gabriel Garcia Marquez).

An exciting ceremony occasioned by the reinauguration of the Romanian Honourary Cemetery from Teiș took place in the old voivodeship of Târgoviște, on October 22nd.

The event was part of the restoration project of the heroes' monuments and cemeteries, initiated by the Department for the Relation with the Parliament and Public Information, through the National Office for the Heroes Memory.

Most of the gravestones were replaced, the surrounding fences were rebuilt, the cemeteries' lanes were rearranged and a Maramureș-type wooden roadside crucifix was placed, specific to those existing in World War II.

November 11th – Day of the Veterans of the theatres of operations

This is the day when we celebrate all those who represented their country with honour in theatres of operations, by accomplishing their missions where Romania asked them to, sometimes at the cost of their lives!

Religious sermons were held and military ceremonies were organized at the graves of the 26 heroes who fell on duty in theatres of operations and at the monuments built for the sacrifice and heroism of the Romanian soldiers.

The military ceremony took place in Tineretului Park, at the Monument of the Heroes who fell on Duty in Theatres of Operations and on Romanian territory.

The heroes' families, representatives of the local authorities, military personnel, war veterans and students attended the activities organized at each grave.

first time at the military parade organized this year. The detachment was headed by Colonel
Augustin Pegulescu, injured in Afghanistan.*

*Since 1996 up to present, 26 soldiers sacrificed their lives for the country, while 50 soldiers
out of the 150 ones that were injured, presented arms on the National Day of Romania.*

April 29th – “The Veterans’ Marathon”

In 2015, the volunteer soldiers of “Invictus România” Group conducted a series of actions meant to mark the Veterans’ Year.

On the War Veterans’ Day, the volunteers of “Invictus” ran in the capital city in the “Veterans’ Marathon”. The starting point of the marathon was the Monument of the Heroes who fell on duty in the Theatres of Operations and on the Romanian territory (placed in the proximity of the Children’s National Palace). The Marathon’s route included Tineretului Park, Carol I Park, Viitor Avenue, Panduri Street with the end point at “Carol I” National Defence University. During the marathon, the volunteers of “Invictus România” Association wore a 50-meter long national flag. National, international and olympic medal winning sportsmen of “Steaua” București Sport Club joined the volunteers of “Invictus România”.

Invictus Romania Group made up of sports loving soldiers has as a main goal raising the awareness of the civilian society of the respect and appreciation that must be shown to veterans, injured and disabled soldiers and the successors of the dead personnel participating in military operations.

The activity was organized in Tricolorului Square of the capital city by the Ministry of National Defence, Bucharest Municipality of the Prefect’s Office and the Capital City Hall, on the occasion of the Day of the National Flag proclaimed on June 26th.

The challenge entitled “For My Hero!” consisted in lighting a candle in memory of the chosen hero, in laying a flower or a national flag at one of the monuments or taking pictures while carrying a sheet of paper with the name of a hero and posting it on MoND Facebook page, in the Events section.



The President of Romania, Klaus Iohannis, signed several decrees for the promotion in rank of 11 retired and reserve war veterans.

Also, President Iohannis sent a message in which he expressed his gratitude for the sacrifices made by the war veterans for their country: "Venerable veterans, we thank you for the sacrifices made for the country. You showed us what patriotism, honour and dignity mean and you earned a place in national history. Romania will show you eternal gratitude!"

By order of the Minister of National Defence, retired commissioned officers, warrant officers and non-commissioned officers were promoted to the next rank, no higher than the rank of lieutenant-colonel on May 9th, on Victory Day.

Royal Dinner in Honour of the Veterans

On April 29th, war veterans were honoured by the Royal House during an official dinner offered by Princess Margareta in the name of King Mihai, to celebrate 70 years since the end of World War II. The special guests invited to this event were 60 veterans, heroes of World War II, widows of those who lost their lives on the battlefield, representatives of the Ministry of National Defence and members of the Diplomatic Corps accredited to Bucharest.

On August 23rd, 1944, King Mihai decided to initiate the negotiations of the truce with the Allies. Historians worldwide appreciate that this put an end to the war six months earlier sparing hundreds of thousands of lives.

Philatelic and numismatic emission dedicated to the celebration of 70 years since the end of World War II

The National Bank of Romania and Romfilatelia launched special emissions in order to bring to the public attention the special historical significance of the Year of War Veterans and to mark 70 years since the end of World War II.

On April 29th, the National Bank of Romania introduced a 10-lei silver coin into the numismatic circuit while Romfilatelia launched a 4.30 lei stamp entitled "70 years since the end of World War II in Europe".

The first Romanian military cemetery from the Russian Federation was inaugurated on October 25th, on the Day of the Romanian Armed Forces, in Rossoska locality, Volgograd region (former Stalingrad), as part of the Commemorative Complex bearing the same name.

The necropolis shelters the remains of all Romanian soldiers who lost their lives in the battle of Stalingrad. The names of the localities from Volograd and Kalmukia area which hosted Romanian battlefield cemeteries are carved on 22 black granite plaques. The remains of the Romanian soldiers buried there are or are going to be exhumed in order to be moved to Rossoska.

The Romanian Cemetery of Honour was built in 2015 due to the conjugated efforts of the Romanian and Russian authorities with responsibilities in the field.

The remembrance of veterans – importance to the Romanian and French officials

A French delegation headed by Mr. Jean-Marc Todeschini, Minister of State for Veterans and Remembrance in the French Ministry of Defence, paid a visit to Romania on March 12th, as part of a wide visit program dedicated to the memory of the soldiers who fell on the Eastern front during WWI.

In the first part of its visit to Romania, the French delegation participated in a round table with the students of Anna de Noailles High-school, discussions that were attended also by Romanian war veterans.

In the second part of its visit, the French delegation and a MoND delegation headed by State Secretary Otilia Sava had official talks about the remembrance to the veterans, the heroes who died in the battlefield and other victims of the conflagrations.
